The Museu d'Art Contemporani de Barcelona (MACBA) is a public institution engaged in the conservation, exhibition and study of contemporary art. We offer diverse visions designed to generate critical debate about the art and culture of our times. MACBA seeks to reach a broad audience and is an open institution with space for public representation that prioritises education, risk-taking and networking with other institutions. These goals place MACBA at the forefront of contemporary art in Catalonia and confirm Barcelona's position both as a capital of culture and as an international benchmark.

Since opening to the public on 28 November 1995, MACBA has achieved an international reputation as an institutional model in the field of contemporary art. The substantial growth of the Collection makes it possible to chart a path through the principal reference points in contemporary art, while its visions and narratives about recent art history and the art of today position MACBA in the vanguard of artistic innovation.

ART, TWO **POINTS**

BARCELONA LIVES CONTEMPORARY ART.

Barcelona has witnessed an oscillating dialogue between transforming modernity and the impulse of the radical, revolutionary avant-gardes. Although the avant-garde appeared only timidly and sporadically in the opening decades of the twentieth century, its meanings have been woven into the public consciousness of the city and its representation.


At MACBA, the exhibition ART, TWO POINTS presents an unconventional vision of this dialogue between modernity and the avant-garde. Far from providing a chronological guide, the exhibition revolves around basic themes that examine works and documents from the past through the prism of contemporary creativity. The 1888 Universal Exposition and the 1929 International Exposition raised Barcelona's awareness of modernity, preparing the ground for a contemporary scene that embraces new artistic facets and groundbreaking aesthetic proposals. ART, TWO POINTS traces this trajectory as far as the institutionalisation of the art avant-garde in the eighties and nineties and Barcelona's newly integrated position within the global culture and economy.

This itinerary is illustrated by more than 350 works by artists such as Ignasi Aballí, Joan Brossa, Eduardo Chillida, Jordi Colomer, Pep Duran, Öyvind Fahlström, Lucio Fontana, Richard Hamilton, Joan Hernández Pijuan, Jenny Holzer, Paul Klee, Muntadas, Juan Muñoz, Martha Rosler, Dieter Roth, Jeff Wall and others.

Together with MACBA, ART, TWO POINTS is presented simultaneously at CaixaForum, where the focus is on the arrival point of this artistic journey in the eighties and nineties. You are warmly invited to visit both centres, which together constitute a common narrative.




Focus on the works with this symbol. The white dot on the ground indicates the best perspective for focusing.

THE MACBA — COLLECTION

Comprising more than 5,000 works and with a clearly defined personality, the MACBA Collection specialises in the years marking the transition from the twentieth to the twenty-first centuries. The focus is on art made after 1945. from the material abstraction of the fifties through the evolution of European Pop and the avant-gardes of the sixties and seventies. The Collection also spotlights the centrality of the word, the consolidation of photography as an art form and the Post-Minimalist sculpture of the eighties and nineties, together with the work of today's younger artists. Here you will find works by local, national and international artists, with a special interest in contemporary art from the Mediterranean, North Africa and Middle East. Since 2007, the MACBA Study Center has presented aspects of collecting that complement more established interpretations.

The MACBA Consortium is a public-private model formed by Barcelona City Council and the Government of Catalonia, the MACBA Foundation and the Spanish Ministry for Culture. The MACBA Foundation was established in 1987 to unite individuals, organisations and companies in providing acquisition funds to expand the permanent Collection, which is presented as a constantly changing programme of temporary exhibitions that, over the years, have turned contemporary art into a tradition.
